Minutes of the Meeting of the Municipal Parks and Recreation Advisory Board of the Town of Thompson 's Station, Tennessee July 12, 2016

Call to Order:

The meeting of the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board of the Town of Thompson's Station was called to order at 6:00 p.m. on the 12th day of July, 2016 at the Thompson's Station Town Hall with the required quorum. Members, aldermen and staff in attendance were: Chairman Jim Van Vleet; Board Member Kreis White; Board Member Becky Clark; Board Member Shelia Shipman; Vice-Chairman David Coleman, Alderwoman Sarah Benson and Town Planner Wendy Deats. Board Member Layla Bell, Alderman Brinton Davis and Advisor Paula Edenfield were unable to attend.

Business:

1. Approval of Minutes – The minutes of the June 7, 2016 meeting were submitted. Board member Coleman moved to accept the June 7th minutes. The motion was seconded and approved unanimously.

2. Budget Report—Mrs. Deats reviewed the report.

Board member Shipman made a motion to approve. The motion was seconded and approved unanimously.

3. Dog N Pony Show Update – Mr. Jack Davis, owner of JD Events and Promotions came forward to update the Board about sponsorships, stages, vendors, and volunteer opportunities for the Parks Board.

a. Hot Air Balloon Glow – Chairman Van Vleet updated the Board regarding the Hot Air Balloon Glow. He also approached the Board about hosting a race/5k run during the morning of the Dog & Pony Show.
